Dear Parents :שיחיו:

This is the **30th** year that we will be conducting a Yeshivah Summer Learning Program on our campus. It will start Wednesday, June 30/תמוז"ה אי"ה and close on Wednesday, August 18/אלול"ה. Judging from our past experience, this year should be most successful בעזרהי"ת.

Please note space is extremely limited, and we have no choice but to limit enrollment to the first 150 eligible applicants who submit complete applications as delineated on page 2.

WHAT WE OFFER:

1. Exciting daily learning program and special Shabbos program.
2. Beautiful campus, comfortable air-conditioned dormitories, clean fresh air and nourishing, tasty meals.
3. Round the clock supervision by competent, devoted mechanchim and counselors.
4. Visits to the Ohel and 770.
5. Swimming and professional sports leagues on our grounds.
6. Exciting trips to points of interest.
7. An environment of Torah and Chassidus – in the company of our Roshei Yeshiva and older Bachurim who will Farbreng with the Talmidim.

Please note that this is a YESHIVA summer program, not your usual summer camp. And it is most important that your son be aware that a great portion of the day is devoted to learning; discuss this with your son and his Rebbi before applying. Some boys are very fine Yiddishe kinder; however, this program is not suitable for them. Please be realistic about this.

APPLICATIONS:

The following items are crucial for your application to be complete.

1. A copy of your son's most recent report card. (**If** unavailable, a report from your son's Rebbi).
2. Payment schedule as outlined on page 4. Please read and follow precisely. **DO NOT MAIL OR FAX REGISTRATION FORM ALONE!**
3. Registration form.
4. Medical treatment permission form, **Clear copy of your son's insurance card, insurance information form and up to date immunization records.** This does not require a physician's signature.
5. Completed application for food program – regardless of your citizenship and **whether or not you believe you are eligible!** (This will save you money as outlined on page 4).
6. A note written by your son in which he assures us that he will do his utmost to behave, learn and act like a בחור חסידשער בהור with דרך ארץ and יראת שמים.

The above 6 items are to reach the office as soon as possible, in **one** envelope. The envelope should be addressed to the Yeshiva Summer Program, P.O. Box 1996, Morristown, NJ 07962-1996.

7. Send along sufficient, appropriate clothing for a Chassidishe Bochor – plain t-shirts and sports shirts are allowed during the week; also: linens, blankets, pillows and a sleeping bag. There are coin-operated washers and dryers on the premises and in the area. Please do not send along valuable items, as we cannot be responsible for their safe keeping. While we will do our utmost to ensure the safety of your child's belongings, we cannot be held responsible for anything lost or stolen.

No bicycles, firecrackers, A/C (all rooms are A/C equipped), knives, skates, skateboards, rollerblades, refrigerators or expensive games. No electronic popcorn machines, sandwich makers, etc. Please do not send along radios or tapes and books שלא על טהרת הקודש. No radio/tape recorders or cellular phones. Plain tape recorders are allowed.

8. Parents are responsible for any medical bills ה"ו or other expenses incurred by their son. They will be deducted from your \$100 security if not paid by the end of the program.

No student will be accepted into the program without parents having medical insurance to cover medical bills.

9. Our transportation for the Y.S.P. is from Crown Heights to Morristown and at the season end from Morristown to Crown Heights. Additional transportation requirements must, if necessary, be your responsibility.
10. Kindly retain this letter for future reference, if your son plans to attend.

After your son is accepted, you will receive this year's learning schedule and the exact time for departure of the busses from Crown Heights to Morristown.

1. The fee is **\$2,600**, which includes a \$150 non-refundable fee. This covers all expenses except laundry and Seforim, which your son will bring as required.

If you fill out the enclosed Summer Food Eligibility Application – your fee will be reduced by \$300 to **\$2,300** – whether you qualify or not. If you reside in a foreign country, list your income in US dollar equivalent.

2. The **entire** amount, in one payment or post-dated checks, along with all items as outlined on page 2 must be received in our office at one time. If you prefer to send post-dated checks, they should be payable during February, March, April and May. **May 15** is the latest date. **DO NOT** ask us to hold checks “that you wish to exchange”. Also, if you plan on receiving scholarship fund assistance, we will refund the amounts as soon as the scholarship fund checks clear. **Regardless – the entire amount is due by May 15!** To pay by credit card, complete the credit card authorization form, there is a surcharge for this service.

Foreigners (including Canadians) are to pay with checks drawn on U.S. funds in U.S. banks or by international money order. No private foreign checks will be accepted, even if the words U.S. funds are written on the check.

3. Security Deposit: A separate \$100 check as security is to be sent **now, dated June 1, 2010**. If you are paying tuition by credit card this cannot be charged to your credit card – you must send in a separate check. This check will be deposited on this date in a special bank account. If your son causes no damage or does not leave any unpaid expenses, the entire amount will be refunded to you at the end of the program.
 - A) If there is damage, it will be deducted from this check.
 - B) If there is damage in the dorm room and we do not know who caused it, all the residents will share in the payment for the damage. It is important that each *Talmid* understands that this security deposit is being made for these purposes.
 - C) Payment for medical, drugstore or other bills not paid for by August 31 will be deducted.

4. There will be a charge of **\$20.00** for each returned check.

5. The amount of spending money to give your son 'שׂי is at your discretion.
